School Gate

Car Park Reminders.....

- Park only in marked spaces The small wall along the front of the Church is not a marked parking spot. Unfortunately, people often park here when there are still empty spots available
- Drive at 10km per hour
- Avoid double parking anywhere
- Use the disabled spaces legitimately
- Drive around until a spot becomes available
- Delay pick up in the afternoons children are supervised until 3.40pm
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At kiss and drop in the mornings:

- Drive to the end of the area slowly
- Children alight on the passenger side only with their bags
- Parents remain in the car
- Drive off carefully

Building Child Safe Communities - New Forms for All Volunteers

There have been several changes to Child Protection requirements for volunteers. Parents/close relative volunteers are now **EXEMPT** from obtaining the Working with Children Check (WWCC), however it is most important that you still complete the volunteers training on the Parramatta CEDP website. This is a requirement.

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that all volunteers complete an online 'Undertaking Form' that confirms expectations in relation to

behaviour whilst volunteering at schools, Catholic out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

Volunteers – please click on 'Building Child Safe Communities – Undertaking for Volunteers' or access the form via the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta public webpage http://www.parra.catholic.edu.au, then click on 'Child Protection Training Forms' (halfway down page on the right hand side).

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted. Your details are maintained confidentially in a central database and a copy of your confirmation is emailed to the location where you are volunteering.

A new form is required for each location that you are a volunteer or contractor or if any of the details you have provided on the form change.

We thank all volunteers and contractors for their continued support of Catholic Education.

Medical Alerts

The health and wellbeing of our students is of paramount importance to us and keeping this in mind there are a few things that we need to ask you to do.

Anaphylaxis

We ask that parents of children who are at risk of Anaphylaxis provide the school with an updated Anaphylaxis Action Plan, signed by a doctor, together with an Epipen or Anapen and any other medication required. If you have not done this, please do so immediately.

Asthma

Many of our children are Asthma sufferers – we ask that parents provide us with an up to date Asthma plan for their child together with their own Asthma medication. Please be reassured if your child forgets to bring their medication to school there is always Ventolin in the school office.

Food Allergies

Several children at our school suffer from food allergies – some very severe. We wish to remind you that in line with our policy we ask that you do not send gift items such as lollies, birthday cakes etc for your child to give to other children. At times, teachers do give food treats to the children but they always check the suitability of these treats with the parents of children with allergies.

Your cooperation with the above will help us to keep your children safe and well while they are in our care.
