Dr Michael Carr-Gregg How to raise resilient children

On Monday night, the Parent Representative Council for the Parramatta Diocese hosted a talk by the renowned psychologist Dr Michael Carr-Gregg. I attended this talk because, as many of you would know, I am trying myself to raise a happy and resilient teenager. It was great to see so many of our parents also in attendance.



One of the points that really spoke to me from Dr Carr-Gregg was the need to be really present for our children. One on one time is priceless. He spoke about nurturing the bond between parent and child as it is the greatest insurance policy we can have in raising resilient children.

It is often difficult to communicate with our children - especially as they become teenagers, with the busy lives we lead and with the ever increasing dependency on digital technologies.

The following are some tips for communication with young people taken directly from Dr Carr-Greggs presentation.

- Keep Calm
- Don't talk too much and listen more
- Speak only two sentences at a time and keep it short
- Use humour (but not sarcasm)
- Set very clear limits and boundaries
- Avoid confrontations or ultimatums
- Only argue over things that matter (tidy rooms don't matter)
- Give them Vitamin 'N' (It's ok to say NO)
- Be the world expert on them
- Have rituals and traditions (nurture and honour these)
- Do not give them everything they want
- Keep them busy
- Let them experience adversity.

As a parent and educator I found the presentation to be very affirming of the role that we play in our children's lives.

Work Health and Safety Reminders

KISS 'N' DROP - IMPORTANT REMINDER

We have recently been approached by a number of parents using Kiss 'n' Drop in the mornings and asked to remind you of the procedure. Parents using this procedure correctly are becoming increasingly frustrated by the hold ups caused by parents getting out of the car to assist their children. If you need to get out of the car to assist your child, please park in the allocated spaces and walk your child into school.

- Drive right to the end of the paved area leaving room for cars entering the zone behind you.
- Children are to have their school bags with them getting bags out of the boot causes delay and is unsafe.
- Drivers are to remain in their cars
- Children are to alight on the passenger side of the car with their bags
- Drivers are to exit the area slowly to rejoin the traffic.
