Grounds update

One of the many agendas that continues to remain my priority is the enhancement of our playground and school. There have been many improvements made such as the new access ramps, sensory boards, line and step marking, replacement of all lighting, the installation of solar panels and purchasing of additional play equipment (large building blocks, balance beams, giant lego etc - which are all in storage due to COVID19 restrictions at this time). Last week, I met with a group of Year 6 representatives to establish student voice about the colour of the replacement shade sail on the playground and we expect that this work will be undertaken in the very near future. Last term and this term, I've also met with a number of contractors to establish quotes for replacing the damaged playground equipment. Once these quotes are submitted by contractors and sent to CEDP for approval we will be able to commence work on this important upgrade. Thank you for your patience and understanding as we have had to work around the limitations of COVID19.

I am very appreciative of our parent community who have provided us with complimentary feedback with regards to our response to COVID19 restrictions and guidelines. Many have commented that they are very grateful for the ability to come onto the grounds to collect their children in the afternoon and to quickly drop them off in the morning with social distance guidelines. 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

No CEDP Zone or Diocesan Athletics Carnivals 2020

ACARA Collection Student Background Data Notice

The Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) collects data from schools to determine the Index of Community Socio-educational Advantage (ICSEA). CEDP is currently working to provide relevant details to the Catholic Education Commission of NSW. Data collected is de-identified of personal information.

Parents and caregivers must advise their school if they don't want their child's data included in this report by 28 August 2020. Copies of Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) Standard Collection Notice and Privacy Policy can be obtained from the school office.

If you are leaving the school, one term's notice in writing is required (except for those graduating Year 6), otherwise you will be charged the term's school fees as per the enrolment agreement. Thank you for your understanding.

Work, Health and Safety Reminders

Social Distancing COVID-19

Thank you for all that you are doing to keep your social distance when collecting your child in the afternoon.

Children who are collected by parents will be lined up in their class groups at different points under the COLA. We respectfully ask that you refrain from entering the COLA area and instead wait on the outside of the COLA for your child to come to you. In this way, we can strive to ensure that we are continuing to respond to social distancing guidelines in our community.

We also ask that when entering the school grounds that you continue to maintain your social distance from others - especially when using the stairs and ramp.

We continue to follow COVID-19 health and safety guidelines and follow advice received from Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta. We will update our families via our Skoolbag App as new information is provided to us.

Our staff continue to be vigilant with monitoring and acting regarding children who appear to be unwell. Please keep your child at home if you think they are sick, runny nose, cough, headache etc If a child presents as unwell at school, they will be isolated from other children and staff in the sick bay or an area of the office. Parents will be contacted to collect their child immediately. We understand that this may be difficult but it is in the best interests of the school community as a whole.

- Additional cleaning is taking place on a daily basis.
- Our staff are reminding students how and when to wash their hands.
- There are soap dispensers in the toilets, and these are topped up regularly.
- Signs have been placed in classrooms and toilets to remind the children and to demonstrate to them appropriate hand washing procedures.
- Each class has been provided with hand sanitizer, disinfectant wipes and additional paper towels.
- All learning spaces have designated "used tissues only" bins with lids which are emptied daily.
- The school has discouraged handshakes, hugs and kisses.
- Please limit the number of people in the foyer to five if there are 5 or more, please wait outside.
- Our amended line up afternoon dismissal procedures are in place and we ask that parents do not enter the space under the COLA, please wait on the outer area for your child.

Thank you all for continuing to keep our community safe.

Defibrillator available in the School Office

Our school is very fortunate to have two Automated External Defibrillators (AED). In the event that one is required, they are kept in our school administration office and the Year 2 learning space. All CEDP (Catholic Education, Diocese of Parramatta) schools now have at least one defibrillator on site.









URGENT REMINDER NEW Building Child Safe Communities - Volunteer Undertaking

All Volunteers have until <u>30 September 2020</u> to submit a <u>new</u> Undertaking in the new system.

In Catholic Education Diocese Parramatta (CEDP), we see parents and carers as partners in your child's learning journey. Parents and carers are encouraged to become involved in our schools in many important ways such as supporting classroom learning, being part of advisory groups, mentoring programs, coaching sporting teams and supporting other extra-curricular activities, canteen support and other kinds of help. A range of checks and undertakings are required for people who work for or provide services to CEDP. These checks reduce potential risk and form part of our strategy to build child safe communities.



CEDP has launched a new *Building Child Safe Communities* form and online training module that all volunteers are required to complete.

The purpose of this training is to inform you of the standards of behaviour and other requirements that must be adhered to when volunteering for CEDP.

The undertaking should take no more than 5 minutes to complete and the training module approximately 10 minutes. Once the form and training modules are submitted, an automated email will be sent to you within two business days to confirm the status of your submission.

The undertaking form will expire within two years or when your Working With Children Check expires (if applicable), whichever is sooner. At that time you will need to complete the undertaking form and training module again. You will receive an automatic reminder email when this occurs.


