NAPLAN - Practice Test

NSW schools participating in NAPLAN Online will participate in practice tests between 22 March and 1 April, 2021. The practice test is a trial-run and key preparation activity for NAPLAN Online in May. It is not an assessment of student ability. Participation in the practice tests is highly beneficial as it allows schools and students to become familiar with the online assessment platform and tools and processes. At St Paul's students will complete their practice tests on Wednesday 24 and Thursday 25 March.

Sunday 21 March is Harmony Day - The theme for Harmony Day this year is - **Everyone Belongs**

Harmony Day across Australia is traditionally a day to celebrate Australian Multiculturalism and the successful integration of migrants into our community. Australia is one of the most successful multicultural countries in the world and we should celebrate this and work to maintain it. Numeracy Learning

The Extending Mathematical Understanding (EMU) groups are well underway at St. Paul's. This year, Mrs Baird has allocated resources to ensure that EMU groups are available at both the Early Years (Year One) and Middle Years (Year 4). Mrs Sargent and Mrs Lambert have the privilege of leading these groups in 2021. EMU groups are held daily and provide targeted intervention for students based on the February MAI data and additional EMU assessments. The programs run for 10-20 weeks, and provide opportunities for exploring and describing quantity, and rich investigations that highlight mathematical thinking and problem solving. Finally, students engage in a focused reflection activity and complete home activities every day.

During these lessons, there is a focus on developing Mathematical language and using a 'Growth Mindset' to think positively about challenge. As you can see in the pictures attached, children in the Year 1 EMU group have identified ways their learning can 'Hatch!' when they apply a growth mindset.

Children are thoroughly settled into their groups, and eagerly the classroom, ready to understandings with the class. Watch this space!

The Premier's Reading Challenge officially opened on Monday, 1 March 2020 and will run until Friday, 20 August.


Participation in the challenge is optional but we would love as many

All student Reading Records are submitted online by parents using their child/rens









cannot remember them. New students to the school this year should have received a separate note with your User ID and Password. All students entering and successfully completing the Premiers Reading Challenge will receive an official PRC Certificate.

To successfully complete the Challenge the student must have an online reading record entered and validated by Friday 20 August. Students must complete a set amount of reading to meet the Challenge, see table below.



Social Distancing COVID-19

Our staff continue to be vigilant with monitoring and acting regarding children who appear to be unwell. Please keep your child at home if you think they are sick, runny nose, cough, headache etc If a child presents as unwell at school, they will be isolated from other children and staff in the sick bay or an area of the office. Parents will be contacted to collect their child immediately. We understand that this may be difficult but it is in the best interests of the school community as a whole.



- Additional cleaning is taking place on a daily basis.
- Our staff are reminding students how and when to wash their hands.
- There are soap dispensers in the toilets, and these are topped up regularly.
- Signs have been placed in classrooms and toilets to remind the children and to demonstrate to them appropriate hand washing procedures.
- Each class has been provided with hand sanitizer, disinfectant wipes and additional paper towels.
- All learning spaces have designated "used tissues only" bins with lids which are emptied daily.
- The school has discouraged handshakes, hugs and kisses.
- Please limit the number of people in the foyer to five if there are 5 or more, please wait outside.
- Our amended line up afternoon dismissal procedures are in place and we ask that parents do not enter the space under the COLA, please wait on the outer area for your child.
