REST@ St. Pauls

To address the differing needs of students at our school and in an aim to create an environment where children feel safe and happy we have reopened a classroom at lunchtime. This room is called REST and it stands for **R**espect, **E**veryone, **S**olving problems, **T**ogether. Children are invited to attend REST if their teachers believe they would benefit from the skills being taught in this room at lunch time. During their time at REST, children are taught social skills such as turn taking, problem solving and compromise through games. Values such as respect, tolerance and empathy are also promoted through the REST program. We also recognise that some children need a soft, quiet designated place where they can relax and have some space away from the busy areas on the playground.

Children are encouraged to use the strategies learned in REST when they transition back into the playground. If you have any questions about the REST program, please feel free to contact me at school. Thank you for your continued support of our school community.

NAPLAN

Next week, children in Year 3 and Year 5 will complete NAPLAN testing (National Assessment Program for Literacy and Numeracy). These assessments are conducted nationwide by ACARA, the Australian Curriculum Assessment and Reporting Authority, and will assess children's literacy and numeracy skills. Children will complete these assessments every two years starting in Year 3, until they reach Yr 9 in high school.

There will be four assessments across the week, including:

- Writing, scheduled for Tuesday 10 May
- Reading, scheduled for Wednesday 11 May
- Language Conventions, scheduled for 12 May
- Numeracy, scheduled for 13 May

Support has already been arranged for students with additional learning needs. This is based on the regular support students may receive in the classroom, including during assessment tasks. Staff have made contact with qualifying families earlier in Term 1. Opportunities for 'catch up' tests will be available in Week 4 for children who have been unwell and unable to complete NAPLAN testing in Week 3.

NAPLAN testing is one of many tools we use at St. Paul's to monitor and track your child's progress. The results from these standardised assessments provide information for students, parents and teachers which can be used to improve student achievement.

However, it is important to note that this test is only a 'snapshot' of your child's learning on one particular day. Teachers consistently engage in many other forms of assessments to build their knowledge of your child, their progress and next steps for their learning.

If you are ever concerned about your child, their learning or wellbeing, we encourage you to make contact with your child's teacher to discuss your concerns. Our staff are committed to ensuring your child's learning remains a priority throughout their journey at St. Paul's and are dedicated to providing learning opportunities at your child's point of need.

NAPLAN tests are assessed externally, and the results shared with the school later in the year (usually in Term 3).

Inquiry Learning

This term, students have a new driving question they will be investigating during Inquiry Learning. Early Stage 1, Stage 1 and Stage 2 students are all engaging in a Science inquiry this term. Students in Stage 3 are exploring a History inquiry. The driving questions each stage will focus on this term are listed below.

Driving Questions across the School

Early Stage 1: What is it made of and how does it move?

Stage 1: How does the Earth change and provide for us?

Stage 2: How are environments and living things interdependent and why have food technologies and techniques been created to produce healthy foods?

Stage 3: What do we know about the lives of people in Australia's colonial past and how do we know?

Inquiry in Kindyl

In Kindergarten, we have been eagerly investigating: What is it made of and how does it move?

As mini-scientists, Kindergarten students have been busy learning about the physical characteristics of objects and the effects of these on how they move. Kindergarten have started planning and conducting investigations around force and motion and have looked at the properties of a variety of materials.

The students are looking forward to using their new knowledge to design and create a comfortable, sheltered mode of transportation for the class toys.







PBS4L

St Paul's utilises our PBS4L (Positive Behaviour Support for Learning) Framework to foster positive behaviours and relationships amongst all students. The children commenced the term by revising the classroom and playground expectations. Each grade is currently focusing on a specific classroom goal that encourages safe and respectful actions. Each time the grade demonstrates this objective, they earn a "lion for their den". Once ten lions have been earned, the grade receives recognition for their positive behaviours.

The whole school PBS4L focus for Week One was to be in the right place at the right time. The children are expected to be in the correct location during each session. They demonstrate this focus by waiting in their designated areas in two straight lines when the bell rings. Well done to everyone for continuing to be safe, respectful learners.

General School Information

Staffing update

Changeover into Winter Uniform

From Monday May 9, all children are expected to wear their **full** winter uniform. Please label all items clearly, especially hats and jackets. Children are responsible for their own belongings. Lost property is placed in a tub in the Undercroft.

Complaints Handling

St Paul the Apostle Primary School has written protocols in place to address complaints and grievances. These protocols are in line with the CEDP Complaint Handling Policy. A copy of this policy is available on the Catholic Education Office website.

From time to time incidents occur involving one or more children. The school deals with these matters internally following our policies and procedures. If necessary, parents are contacted. At St Paul the Apostle Primary School we are proactive in this area and aim to always address all matters and follow up appropriately. If any parent has a complaint or a concern about any issues impacting on their child, they need to make contact with the class teacher in the first instance. We also have Leaders of Learning who are available to assist in resolving the complaint. If the matter is not resolved the Assistant Principal/Principal should be contacted. **At no time should an adult approach or reprimand a student at this school** (excluding their own child) for any reason or under any circumstances. At all times, when dealing with student conflicts, the school will adhere to the policy of procedural fairness. When a situation of conflict arises, the situation will be dealt with promptly and with fairness and impartiality. This means that the school will provide a safe and respectful environment where all members of the community feel confident and comfortable to speak.

COVID 19 Updates

Under the latest public health advice, testing and isolation are no longer mandatory after being exposed to someone with COVID-19 in school settings. However, we recommend that you consider the information provided by NSW Health about exposure to COVID-19 when making decisions for your child and family.

Students and staff cannot attend school if they are showing any symptoms of COVID-19. These include fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, runny nose, loss of smell/taste, muscle/joint pains, diarrhoea, nausea/vomiting, extreme tiredness, unexplained chest pain or conjunctivitis (eye infection).

If symptoms occur at any time, your child should undertake a rapid antigen test (RAT). If the RAT is positive, your child should isolate as someone who has tested positive for COVID-19. If you cannot access a RAT, you can attend a PCR (nose and throat swab) testing clinic. Our school has a limited supply of RATs that students can use for symptomatic testing or daily testing as part of requirements for close contacts returning to school. All families received their latest supply of RATs this week.

You must register any positive test on the Service NSW website or Service NSW app so that you can be linked to important health care support and advice. Please ensure that you select your school name when prompted when registering a positive test for your child.

We really appreciate your support of our COVID-safe measures at school and will continue to keep you updated.

Building Child Safe Communities Training for Volunteers

In Catholic Education Diocese Parramatta (CEDP), we see parents and carers as partners in your child's learning journey. Parents and carers are encouraged to become involved in our schools in many important ways such as supporting classroom learning, being part of advisory groups, mentoring programs, coaching sporting teams and supporting other extra-curricular activities, canteen support and other kinds of help.

A range of checks and undertakings are required for people who work for or provide services to CEDP. These checks reduce potential risk and form part of our strategy to build child safe communities.

The CEDP **Building Child Safe Communities** form and online training module is the training that all volunteers are required to complete.

The purpose of this training is to inform you of the standards of behaviour and other requirements that must be adhered to when volunteering for CEDP.

The undertaking should take no more than 5 minutes to complete and the training module approximately 10 minutes. Once the form and training modules are submitted, an automated email will be sent to you within two business days to confirm the status of your submission.

The undertaking form will expire within two years or when your Working With Children Check expires (if applicable), whichever is sooner. At that time you will need to complete the undertaking form and training module again. You will receive an automatic reminder email when this occurs.
